TCCC Membership

Membership to TCCC is 7 days a week, 9a to 9p. Our facility is perpetually maintained with lofty improvement goals. Current members enjoy covered buildings for protection in inclement weather; a 300-200-100 yard bay, tactical bay, pistol bay for practice under lights for when the days grow short again. We offer Skeet / Trap on Thursdays and Sundays – with fully lighted fields. In the fall, we host 5-Stand, which is also a great time to have a group outing. The Business Office is open on Thursdays 530p to 8p, and Sunday afternoon 1p to 4p. We encourage applying for Membership on our website however, during business office hours we will accept your paper application in person. Membership remains at \$50 for current year with a \$20 initiation fee, or \$100 for 2-years (waives initiation fee). New Members attend orientation, receiving a new member packet, membership card/gate key, rules review and grounds tour.
