

Tuscola County Conservation Club Newsletter June, 2019

The Tuscola County Conservation Club is managed by a volunteer board of directors and an active membership of over 300 shooters with several members actively championing duties around the Club. TCCC provides an excellent recreational opportunity as we believe in a facility with resources that promote family participation and fellowship within the shooting sports. Our objectives are to preserve and encourage participation in recreational and organized competitive shooting sports, with attention on the safety and education of firearm skills. Our organization embraces the characteristics and development of honesty, integrity, good fellowship, self-discipline, and team play, which are essential to good sportsmanship and the foundation of true patriotism.

<u>Membership</u>

TCCC Membership includes a spouse and your minor children for only \$70 dues per calendar year (or 2019/2020 for dues of \$100). Already have a membership? Consider a gift membership! Our facility includes an enclosed 300-yard rifle range (Bay 9), skeet and trap fields (fields 13 thru 16), an enclosed and lighted pistol range (Bay 4), an enclosed and lighted tactical bay (Bay 3), and Bay 8 aka "the old bow bay" has a hard canopy staging stations against the rain. Bay 10 is under construction, but this "monster" bay promises to be the largest of all the shooting bays. There is a large heated hall, comfy clubhouse and the friendliest members anywhere! Dues are invested directly back into the Club after operations and maintenance expenses; they are the significant portion of our income. Improving the shooting experience is priority, taking pride in and striving to be, one of the best gun clubs in the state.

TCCC Range Map

Some of you may have already noticed we have updated the satellite map of the range facilities with a key denoting not only our buildings and fields, but an easy reference to know the names of each shooting bay. Hopefully this map will serve in removing any guess work for our competitive shooting guests, youth, and training event participants as well as new members in general. Just as we have referenced above that the youth will be shooting on Bay 8, likewise if you participate in any of our shooting competitions, squads will begin the day at different designated bays set up with paper and steel targets. If you are new to the club, this process can be confusing. All bays at the club can potentially be incorporated into a competitive match.

The map is a helpful tool that segues into identifying bays that may be set up in advance for a competitive shoot and/or training through the year. Events start early and to enable organizers to bring an excellent shooting experience to participants, planning must be done in advance. The calendar on the tcccmi.com website has all events listed. So if you see a bay set up with paper targets stands, walls, steel poppers, Texas stars, etc., anything that is not a permanent structure then >> please leave the bay alone. It is there for an event.

Pistol Practice

Once again, TCCC is hosting a pistol and PCC practice night – first and third Monday through September. Participants practice moving while executing timely mag changes, concentrating on "shoot / no shoot" targets with a "shoot'em as you see'em" strategy. We welcome all skill levels, however we recommend a strong side holster for pistol, at least 2 mags for mag changes as part of the exercises. THEN > when there are five Monday's in a month: namely 5th Monday in July & Sept, we are running USPSA mini-matches. CPL/CCW Classes

Concealed Pistol License Classes (CPL/CCW) are held monthly at TCCC. The next class will be held July 13. What to expect? There will be five hours of classroom. A Law Enforcement Officer or an Attorney will present a State of Michigan legal review of concealed pistol license and concealed carry laws, liabilities, and responsibilities, which will include a Q&A period. There will also be three hours of outdoor range time (please dress appropriately in case of inclement weather). No experience required. Lunch will be provided. NRA Defensive Pistol - Levels 1, 2 & 3

CPL holders qualify to attend these intense handgun training courses. <u>Level 1</u> is classroom and range training covering the fundamentals of defensive pistol shooting. Topics examined in class include the importance of carrying and using a pistol responsibly and ethically for personal protection; how the NRA Rules for Safe Gun Handling are applied to concealed carry; basic principles of concealment; presenting a pistol, re-holstering from concealment and shooting targets at varying distances; reloading under stress; clearing common stoppages ...and more! <u>Levels 2 and 3 turn up the heat!</u> Watch the webpage for newly posted classes and ramp up your skills to the next level! https://www.tcccmi.com/classes.htm

3-Gun / B.R.A.S.S. is also well underway this year - a higher skill level of competition for the ready-for-action shooter! One of the fastest growing shooting sports in the country is this action-packed multi-gun competition sport. In most matches, competitors use three different firearms (a modern sporting rifle aka AR, a pistol, and a shotgun). A shooter moves through different stages, engaging shoot/no-shoot targets in a variety of different positions (sometimes targets are moving!) while requiring different firearms to be transitioned at the same time by the participant. Targets can be clay pigeons, cardboard silhouettes, steel "poppers", or even targets that swing leaving the shooter only seconds to react! Shooters who hit the most targets (avoiding no-shoot targets) in the fastest time – win! - No Armor Piercing Ammo Allowed (green tip).
- Do not shoot Glass targets; do not shoot at the ground, nor the cement blocks, or under the influence of drugs or alcohol.
- Mandatory visual confirmation of a clear range or bay is required prior to shooting.
- Safety is our first concern and thereby all Members are expected to wear eye and ear protection, or they will be excused from the Club Grounds.
- Rules of the Club are mandatory and are to be followed for the safety and protection of all.
